Memory Verse: <u>Galatians 2:16</u> Knowing that a man is not justified [declared righteous] by the works of the law, but by the faith of **Jesus** Christ, even we have believed in **Jesus Christ**, that we might be justified by the faith of **Christ**, and not by the works of the law: for by the works of the law shall no flesh be justified.

The reality is that the Gospel is always at stake in our lives.

A. The matter of _____ (v. 15-18)

<u>Job 9:2</u> I know it is so of a truth: but how should man be just with **God**?

Romans 1:17 For therein is the righteousness of **God** revealed from faith to faith: as it is written, "The just shall live by faith."

1. The Jewish Christian _____ (v. 15-16)

Cf. Romans 3:23

Romans 3:20 Therefore by the deeds of the law there shall no flesh be justified in **His** sight: for by the law *is* the knowledge of sin.

<u>Romans 7:7</u> What shall we say then? *Is* the law sin? **God** forbid. Nay, I had not known sin, but by the law: for I had not known lust, except the law had said, Thou shalt not covet.

"Justification" is the act of God whereby the believing sinner is "declared righteous" solely on the merits of Christ's righteousness.

<u>Romans 3:24</u> Being justified [declared righteous] freely [without merit] by His grace through the redemption [paid for by] that is in Christ Jesus:

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<u>Romans 5:1</u> Therefore being justified [declared righteous] by faith, we have peace [quietness / tranquility of mind] with God through our Lord Jesus Christ:

<u>Matthew 9:12</u> But when Jesus heard *that,* he said unto them, They that be whole need not a physician, but they that are sick.

Since the law cannot save, both the Jew and Gentile stood on the same ground before God—both are lost and in need of Christ.

2. The Jewish Christian _____ (v. 17-18)

Paul is asking Peter, "Can this really be true?" "Did Christ then encourage you sin by calling you to place your faith in Him alone for salvation?"

"...God forbid!" - Paul answers his own question by saying, "God forbid!"—A thousand times, NO!

Q: What am I depending upon for salvation? Is it Christ work or my own works?

What is my next step? (READ Galatians 2:19-21 for Sunday, 7/19 – meditate upon v. 20)

(*Put off*) What must I put off that is both hinder my walk with Christ or someone else's?

(*Renew your mind*) What qualities or Words of Christ must I meditate upon?

(*Put on*) What qualities of Christ must I seek to have as a characteristic of my life?
