"PAUL'S PRACTICE OF HIS	GOSPEL MESSAGE" (Part 3)

Memory Verse: <u>Galatians 2:20</u> I am crucified with **Christ**: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but **Christ** liveth in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the **Son of God**, **Who** loved me, and gave **Himself** for me.

The reality is that the Gospel is always at stake in our lives.

 - A. The matter of *Justification* (v. 15-18)
 - 1. The Jewish Christian *Position* (v. 15-16)

"Justification" is the act of God whereby the believing sinner is "declared righteous" solely on the merits of Christ's righteousness. It is not only "just as if I had never sinned," but also the fact that God now and forever sees the saint as righteous because as He looks upon the saint, He sees the righteousness of His Son.

- a. Justification is an <u>act</u>—Justification is *an act* and not a process.
- b. Justification is an act of <u>God</u>—"It is God that justifieth" (Romans 8:33)
- c. Justification is a <u>declaration</u>—God <u>declares</u> the believing sinner righteous
- d. Justification deals with <u>sinners</u>—God justifies <u>sinners</u>, not "good people" (Romans 5:6)
- 2. The Jewish Christian _____ (v. 17-18)

Paul is asking Peter, "Can this really be true?" "Did Christ then encourage you sin by calling you to place your faith in Him alone for salvation?"

B. The matter of ______ (v. 19-20)

1. The _____ of the law—Our
____ (v. 19)

Freedom from the law is freedom to live—"live unto God."

Cf. John 10:10; 1 Corinthians 10:31; Colossians 3:17; 2 Corinthians 5:15

Our ruling motive—our habitual goal should be to glorify God in everything we do—our Christian behavior should be to the glory of God.

<u>Romans 6:6</u> Knowing this, that our old man is crucified with *Him*, that the body of sin might be destroyed, that henceforth we should not serve sin.

When Christ rose from the dead, I rose from the dead. Through faith in Christ, I am both identified with Him in His death and in His resurrection.

Just as we are identified with Christ in His death and life, <u>His life and death should be identified in us</u>. "And be found in Him" (Phil. 3:9) – **But is HE found in me?**

Cf. Philippians 1:6

2 Timothy 1:12 ...nevertheless I am not ashamed: for I know **Whom** I have believed, and am persuaded that **He** is able to keep that which I have committed unto **Him** against that day.

Cf. Philippians 2:13; 2 Corinthians 9:8
