Study: Galatians

Text: Galatians 5:13-15

"LIVING IN LIBERTY, NOT LICENSE" (Part 2)

Sanctification is the inward work of the Holy Spirit in the believer's life to spiritually grow him and change him into the image of Christ. **Therefore our sanctification is the process of becoming like Christ.**

- I. Living in Liberty, not *Legalism* (5:1-12)
- II. Living in Liberty, not *License* (v. 13-15)

Q: Who do you serve? The answer to this question defines your Christian liberty.

We have been called to a life of service in worship to God.

Illustration: God's commandment regarding a slave (Exodus 21)

John 14:15 If ye love Me, keep My commandments.

Christian living that is ruled by <u>law</u> is *legalism*. Christian living that is ruled by <u>lust</u> is *license*. Christian living that is ruled by <u>love</u> is *liberty*.

- A. The ______ Use of Christian Liberty—Serving <u>Self</u> (v. 13b)
 - 1. Liberty ruled by <u>lust</u>—_____ limitations
 - + NOT Liberty to _____ the flesh

It is a matter of *lust* vs. *love—lust* appeals to our flesh in **selfishness** while *love* appeals to service in **self<u>less</u>ness**.

- B. The _____ Use of Christian Liberty—Serving <u>Others</u> (v. 13c-14)
 - + Liberty ruled by <u>love</u>—____ limitations
 - + NOT Liberty to _____ the law

Cf. Matthew 22:37-40

This "whole-hearted devotion for God" is developed in our commitment to Christlikeness, along with our growing in the grace and knowledge of Christ, followed by a maturing self-control, endurance and Godliness. The natural outflow of these virtues (2Pe 1:5-6) will be displayed in our brotherly kindness and love (2Pe 1:7) as we "*love thy neighbor as thyself*."

B. The <u>Abuse</u> of Christian Liberty—Serving <u>Self</u> (v. 15)

Q: How do we abuse our Christian liberty?

- + Liberty ruled by *lording*—Love *abused*
- + NOT Liberty to _____ the others

What we see here in v. 15 is Christian liberty that is abused by abusing love in the form of _____ love.

Cf. Galatians 5:26; 1 Corinthians 3:3

<u>Proverbs 13:10</u> Only by pride cometh contention: but with the well advised *is* **Wisdom**.

Shorty Shank – *Biblical love* is a selfless commitment to another's highest good.

Romans 12:10 Be kindly affectioned [*natural family love*] one to another with brotherly love; in honour preferring one another;

John 13:35 By this shall all *men* know that ye are **My** disciples, if ye have love one to another.

Cf. Galatians 5:19-21

Q: "How do we do this?" (answer: Galatians 5:16)

If Christian living that is ruled by our lusting flesh is license, then in order to refuse to "*fulfill the lust of the flesh*" we must "*walk in the Spirit*" of God being led or controlled by His Spirit.

(*Put off*) What must I put off that is both hinder my walk with Christ or someone else's?

(*Renew your mind*) What qualities or Words of Christ must I meditate upon?

(*Put on*) What qualities of Christ must I seek to have as a characteristic of my life?
