"THE FRUIT OF THE SPIRIT	—WALKING WITH LOVE"

The only way for the believer to have success in the Christian life is by "walking in the Spirit"—being dominated by the power of the Holy Spirit dwelling in the life of the believer.

#### I. The Flesh and the Spirit (5:16-21)

We must have our mind saturated and dominated by the person of Jesus Christ.

### II. The Fruit of the Spirit (v. 22-23)

The "fruit of the spirit" is a God empowered <u>attitude</u> of the heart that leads to <u>action</u> which characterizes the life—it is GODly <u>attitude</u> that leads to GODly <u>action</u>.

**John 15:5 I** am the **Vine**, ye *are* the branches: He that abideth in **Me**, and **I** in him, the same bringeth forth much fruit: for without **Me** ye can do nothing.

#### A. Walking with Love

The first aspect of the "fruit of the Spirit" is love.

<u>**1 Peter 4:8**</u> And above all things have fervent charity among yourselves: for charity shall cover the multitude of sins.
