## Study: Galatians Text: Galatians 5:24-26 "THE FRUITFUL, SPIRIT-FILLED LIFE"

*Christian liberty* is the freedom to live our lives in the power of the Holy Spirit thus empowering us to have victory over our flesh.

Christian living that is ruled by <u>law</u> is *legalism*. Christian living that is ruled by the <u>flesh</u> is *license*. Christian living that is ruled by <u>love</u> is *liberty*.

Christian liberty, when rightly implemented, is a denial of self, a devotion to God, with a devotion to serve others. It resists the temptation to serve our self while revealing a servant's heart of love for the Master, seeking to obey Him in all things while expressing itself in loving service for others.

## I. Remember the \_\_\_\_\_\_ of the Fruitful Christian (v. 24)

Paul begins here by reminding the believer of his *position* in Christ. He is helping us to *renew* our mind with truth in order to stabilize us against the power of sin. (cf. Romans 12:2)

<u>Galatians 2:20</u> I am crucified with <u>Christ</u>: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but <u>Christ</u> liveth in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the <u>Son of God</u>, <u>Who</u> loved me, and gave <u>Himself</u> for me.

**Warren Wiersbe** – Christ not only died *for* me, but *I died with Christ*. Christ died for me to remove the *penalty* of my sin, but I died with Christ to break sin's *power*.

Remember that the believer is under new ownership.

**1 Corinthians 6:19-20** What? know ye not that your body is the temple of the **Holy Ghost** *which is* in you, which ye have of **God**, and ye are not your own? **20** For ye are bought with a price: therefore glorify God in your body, and in your spirit, which are God's.

Cf. Ephesians 2:13; Romans 6:6 & 11

<u>Romans 8:13</u> For if ye live after the flesh, ye shall die: but if ye through the **Spirit** do mortify the deeds of the body, ye shall live.

It is imperative that we remember our *position "in Christ."* Our "*flesh"* has been crucified and therefore we have victory over our "*flesh with the affections and lusts.*"
