Study: Galatians

Text: Galatians 5:7-12

"LIVING IN LIBERTY, NOT LEGALISM" (PART 2)

Paul now moves from the *doctrinal* portion of his letter to the *daily living* portion—from *renewing the mind* through knowing what God says is true to *reflecting Christ* in the way we live—ultimately from *argument* to *application*.

As we have been *hearing* what God says, we now are challenged in what to *do* about what God says.

A. Believers and their *Liberty* (v. 1-6)

"Christianity is freedom not bondage. Christ has set us free; so we must stand firm in our freedom and not go back to living in bondage once again."

B. False Teachers and their _____ (v. 7-12)

 - a. Consider the _____ (v. 7)

Q: How does someone hinder you from obeying the truth?

Example: Adam and Eve in the garden (Gen. 2:1-17; 3:1-3).

What was the problem with Eve's answer? She didn't seem to remember God's command very well. She remembered the *privileges*, added to the *prohibition*, and minimized the *penalty*.

Notice that he rebukes them for turning away from the ______ being no longer convinced of the truth. In this Christian race, they began to run after some other goal.

b. Consider the ______ (v. 8)

"This persuasion *cometh* **not..."** – This "*persuasion*" speaks of a deceptive persuasion.

Proverbs 1:10 My son, if sinners entice thee, consent thou not.

<u>1 Peter 2:9</u> But ye *are* a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, an holy nation, a peculiar people; that ye should shew forth the praises of **Him Who** hath called you out of darkness into **His** marvellous light:

God, in His favor, had called them in grace to live a life in grace. Now they were seeking to live a life of works that merited God's favor.
