Study: Galatians

Text: Galatians 6:1-10

"SERVING OTHERS, NOT SELF" (PART 1)

It is important to remember that the context of Galatians 5 & 6 is *Christian*_____.

Christian living that is ruled by <u>law</u> is *legalism*. Christian living that is ruled by the <u>flesh</u> is *license*. Christian living that is ruled by ______ is *liberty*.

Matthew 22:37-40 Jesus said unto him, "Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind.³⁸ This is the first and great commandment.³⁹ And the second *is* like unto it, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself.⁴⁰ On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets."

Our love for God should be displayed in how we love one another.

<u>John 13:34-35</u> "A new commandment I give unto you, That ye love one another; as I have loved you, that ye also love one another." ³⁵ By this shall all *men* know that ye are **My** disciples, if ye have love one to another."

As Christians, we are called to have an "_____" mindset.

Romans 12:10 *Be* kindly affectioned one to another with brotherly love; <u>in</u> <u>honour preferring one another;</u>

Q: So what does this look like?

A: Paul gives us some practical ways to bear the "fruit of the Spirit" by considering others.

I. Serving the *Backslider* by _____ (v. 1)

Someone who is "*overtaken in a fault*" is one who either is caught by someone else as he commits a sin or finds himself caught or snared by sin itself. It carries the idea of being _____.

<u>1</u> Corinthians 10:12 Wherefore let him that thinketh he standeth [*overconfidence being self deceived*] take heed lest he fall [*into sin*].

II. Serving the _____ by *Helping* (v. 2)

In context, the "burden" is the crushing load of legalism.

Cf. Matthew 11:29-30

These "*burdens*" also include failures, temptations, testings, and trials. It also speaks of guilt that is left unconfessed.

The "law of Christ" is the law of love.

This idea of "*thinking himself to be something*" is think of one's self of being too ______ to help someone else.

Romans 12:3 For I say, through the grace given unto me, to every man that is among you, not to think *of himself* more highly [*arrogantly*] than he ought to think; but to think soberly [*proper view of one's self*], according as **God** hath dealt to every man the measure of faith.

B. Be _____ (v. 4)

Cf. Matthew 7:3-5

Instead of focusing on the *failures* of others we focus on the work that God is doing in us.

C. Be _____ (v. 5)

This word, "*burden*" is a different Greek word that what we see in verse 2. This word refers to one's own ______ and obligations.

Q: Who are you serving? Are you serving God or yourself?

Q: How are you serving? Are you serving with pride or humility?

What is my next step?

(*Put off*) What must I put off that is both hinder my walk with Christ or someone else's?

(*Renew your mind*) What qualities or Words of Christ must I meditate upon?

(*Put on*) What qualities of Christ must I seek to have as a characteristic of my life?

- Q: In the first part of v. 7 we read, "*Be not deceived*." How can we be "*deceived*"?
- Q: Read Galatians 6:9. Bearing fruit takes time. What do we fall prey to when we struggle to wait?

Q: In considering Galatians 6:10, read Romans 12:17-21 & Ephesians 5:16. How can we be obedient in "*redeeming the time*?"
