<u>John 5:30</u> I can of **Mine** own self do nothing: as I hear, I judge: and **My** judgment is just; because I seek not **Mine** own will, but the will of the **Father** which hath sent **Me**.

Christ Jesus is our great example of how He loved the Father. Let's consider what His love looked like.

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<u>Matthew 27:43</u> He trusted in **God**; let **Him** [the Father] deliver **Him** [the Son] now, if **He** [the Father] will have **Him** [the Son]: for **He** said, "I am the **Son** of **God**."

He fully trusted in the Father's plan for salvation as He set aside His own desires and yielded to the Father's.

Notice Christ's trust displayed in these words...

<u>John 8:29</u> And **He** that sent **Me** is with **Me**: the **Father** hath not left **Me** alone; for **I** do always those things that please **Him**.

A relationship of love is characterized by trust. Without trust a relationship will be stunted and never reach the intended blessings.

Q: What assurance—trust do I have in my Father's love for me? Am I displaying my love for God in the way I trust Him and yield to Him?

<u>John 4:34</u> Jesus saith unto them, My meat is to do the will of **Him** that sent **Me**, and to finish **His** work.

Cf. Psalm 40:8

<u>Hebrews 12:2</u> Looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of *our* faith; who for the joy that was set before **Him** endured the cross, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of **God**.

Q: How is my joy displaying my love for God?

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<u>John 14:31</u> But that the world may know that I love the **Father**; and as the **Father** gave **Me** commandment, even so I do. Arise, let us go hence.

To love God is to \_\_\_\_\_ Him.

Cf. John 14:23-24

It is important for us to keep in mind that obedience is not just what others see—true obedience is what God sees.

<u>John 17:4</u> I have glorified **Thee** on the earth: I have finished the work which **Thou** gavest **Me** to do.

Cf. Isaiah 1:11-17

<u>Mark 12:33</u> And to love <u>Him</u> with all the heart, and with all the understanding, and with all the soul, and with all the strength, and to love *his* neighbour as himself, is more than all whole burnt offerings and sacrifices.
