A Behavior to (v. 14)
Paul is calling for the believer to be "without" or from this negative behavior. (cf. Ephesians 5:3)
Example of the murmuring Israelites (Exodus 14:11; 15:23-24; 16:1-3 & 7-8)
<u>Psalm 106:24-25</u> Yea, they despised the pleasant land, they believed not His Word: but murmured in their tents, and hearkened not unto the voice of the LORD.
It all starts herewhen we are guilty of these behaviors then we will undermine our effectiveness in the behaviors in the following verses.
B Behavior to (v. 15-16a)
1. A Testimony—"blameless & harmless"
"be blameless and harmless" – this speaks of one's testimony being pure, the or As Christians we are called to live as a real and genuine example of Christ.
Example of Hobab (Num 10:29-30).
Q: Why did Hobab pass up this great opportunity to dwell amongst God's people and enjoy the blessings that God had promised?
2. A Testimony—"shine as lights"
A testimony of a life because of Christ.
2 Corinthians 5:17 Therefore if any man <i>be</i> in Christ , <i>he is</i> a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new.
Cf. Ephesians 5:8; Matthew 5:16
3. A Testimony—"Holding forth the Word of Life"
"Holding forth the Word of life" –The is "Word of Life" that we are to "hold forth" for others to as we hold fast our profession

of faith (Heb. 10:19-25).

II Gained (v. 16b-18)
Cf. 1 Thessalonians 2:19-20
3 John 1:4 I have no greater joy than to hear that my children walk in truth
"that I have not run in vain" – The Christian life is a not a sprint. It takes persistence and
"neither laboured in vain" – This labor speaks of the effort that is need to
Paul desired to look back upon his ministry and see that all of his work was worthwhile—he didn't want to have any wasted effort.
Again, it all starts with "murmuring and disputing." When we are of this negative behavior then we will our effectiveness in the positive behaviors of being "blameless and harmless without rebuke."
The extent to which we "shine as lights" will be by our "murmuring and disputing."
Our in "holding forth the Word of Life" will be undermined.
Finally, the reality of our "rejoicing" will end up being just an unrealized
