II. Know what your _____ must be—be looking for _____ _____(v. 20b)

Q: How should an expectant attitude of Christ's return affect our present lifestyle?

<u>1 John 3:3</u> And every man that hath this hope [*confidence*] in **Him** purifieth [*to make fit for worship*] himself, even as **He** is pure [*undefiled*].

Q: What activities will we be engaged in if we are constantly looking for the return of Christ?

III. Know about your _____be striving for _____likeness (v.21a)

Q: How should the promise of our future complete transformation into Christ-likeness affect our present lifestyle?

IV. Know about universal _____be ____to Christ (v. 21b)

Q: How should the knowledge of future universal submission to Christ affect our present lifestyle?
