The key to God's grace being effective in our lives is submission, humility and dependence.

The "strength" of God is "made perfect" in that it is manifested in the weakness of the humble believer. God's power becomes a reality in the life of the believer when he ceases to rely upon his own strength and in turn depends upon God for strength.
