## † Stewarding Your Time

Q: How do you steward your time?

Keeping in mind that every moment is a gift from God. We have three options with our time:

- <u>Wasting</u> time failing to use it or squandering it in idleness and on our own pleasures.
- <u>Spending</u> time using it for our own purposes.
- Investing time using it for God's purposes and pleasures.

As Christians, our mindset should be the pursuit of Christ as we invest in eternity by *investing* in people. Our almighty God should be our focus. Bringing Him pleasure as we serve our families and friends; as we spend time in ministry for His glory.

**Ephesians 4:1** I therefore, the prisoner of the **Lord**, beseech you that ye walk worthy [appropriately] of the vocation [calling] wherewith ye are called,

This "worthy walk" is living according to divinely set forth life principles.
Our stewardship of life's principles is living by God's designed principles. It is allowing God to lead us, thus orchestrating the events of our lives.
When we "walk in wisdom" we live according to God's standard of living.
Cf. Psalm 23:1-3
<b>"See then that ye walk circumspectly,"</b> – Live with your eyes wide open considering your surroundings. This is purposeful living.
$\underline{\textbf{Colossians 4:5}} - \textbf{Walk in wisdom toward them that are without, redeeming the time.}$
"not as fools, but as wise." – The "fool" lives his own way and does not care about God's way or anyone else's.
To be "wise" is to be skilled. Wise living is the implementation of divine life principles.
Cf. Proverbs 3:5-7; Psalm 119:105
<u>Psalm 119:9</u> Wherewithal shall a young man cleanse his way? by taking heed <i>thereto</i> according to <b>Thy</b> word.
<u>Psalm 119:11</u> Thy Word have I hid in mine heart, that I might not sin against Thee.
