**Premise:** The perspective we maintain as we go through this life is of utmost importance. *Attitude* leads to *action*. Right thinking leads to right living. In order to live right we must think right. In order to live Godly we must think Godly. Our success in our pursuit of holiness is dependent upon a mind renewed with God's truth.

It is imperative that the greatest influence upon our hearts are <u>God</u>ly influences. **The three greatest influences** of the Christian: the *Word* of God, the *Spirit* of God, and the *people* of God.

<u>Galatians 5:13</u> For, brethren, ye have been called unto liberty; only *use* not liberty for an occasion to the flesh, **but by love serve one another.**

| Paul paints quite an ugly picture of who we were outside of Christ (Ephesians 2:2-3).  |  |  |  |  |  |  |  |

Paul's goal for us in v. 1 is that we would be *motivated* by "the mercies of God" to "present" ourselves as a willing, "living sacrifice" in our worship and that our worship would be "holy," "acceptable" and "reasonable service" to God—that our worship would be a "thought through" kind of worship where Christ is the focus and not the Christian. Paul's goal for each of us is that we are **intentional** in the way in which we worship the Lord.
