A QUIET COMMITMENT:

- QUIET your mind and soul before the LORD "Be still, and know that I am God" (Psalm 46:10)
- COMMIT to obedience: *Commit* to doing whatever God will say to you in this message *"to obey is better than sacrifice"* (1 Samuel 15:22)

Prayer was the lifeblood of the early church (Acts 2:42).

James 5:16 Confess *your* faults one to another, and pray one for another, that ye may be healed. The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much.

<u>2 Chronicles 7:14</u> If My people, which are called by My name, shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek My face, and turn from their wicked ways; then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land.

Biblical prayer is submission to the will of God by being obedient to His Word.

DIVINE INVITATION—JEREMIAH 33:2-3

WHO INVITES: "Thus saith the LORD the maker thereof, the LORD that formed it, to establish it; the LORD is His name." (OUR CREATOR)

PRINCIPLE: "Call unto **Me**" (MY RESPONSIBILITY is OBEDIENCE: HUMBLY CALL OUT TO GOD IN PRAYER)

PROMISE: "and I will answer thee, and show thee great and mighty [unsearchable] things, which thou knowest not." (GOD'S RESPONSE TO MY OBEDIENCE)

This places me at God's footstool as His _____. It reminds me of God's sovereignty and my subjection to Him, to serve Him by advancing His kingdom and accomplishing His will.

Introduction—God's (Psalm 24:1-2) I.

It is important to understand that the degree of our *surrender* and *submission* is rooted in our knowledge of God. The more we truly know Him the less of a problem it will be to submit to Him and the more we will desire to surrender all to Him.

Philippians 2:21 For all seek [to crave or worship] their own, not the things which are Jesus Christ's.

Question: "Where does my kingdom not line up with God's?"

В.	Submit to God's	kingdom—Pursue His glory
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<u>Philippians 1:21</u> For to me to live *is* **Christ**, and to die *is* gain.

A Spirit-filled life will consistently seek to advance the kingdom of God.

<u>Romans 14:17</u> For the kingdom of **God** is not meat and drink; but righteousness, and peace, and joy in the **Holy Ghost**.

B. Submit to God's _____ will

Jesus' example: John 5:30; John 6:38; Matthew 26:38

Psalm 40:8 I delight to do Thy will, O my God: yea, Thy law is within my heart.

This prayer brings my *kingdom* and *will* and places it upon the **altar of sacrifice** asking God to **leave only what is of Him**.

POINT OF ACTION: Biblical prayer continues with *surrender* and *submission*. Pray to the Father acknowledging His sovereignty. Be willing to be *ruled* by God. Kneel at His footstool as His humble *subject* being aware of His *righteousness* and your *foolishness*.

<u>Psalm 95:6-7</u> O come, let us worship and bow down: let us kneel before the LORD our Maker. 7 For He *is* our God; and we *are* the people of His pasture, and the sheep of His hand.
