



A QUIET COMMITMENT:

- QUIET your mind and soul before the LORD "Be still, and know that I am God" (Psalm 46:10)
- COMMIT to obedience: *Commit* to doing whatever God will say to you in this message *"to obey is better than sacrifice"* (1 Samuel 15:22)

Prayer was the lifeblood of the early church (Acts 2:42).

James 5:16 Confess *your* faults one to another, and pray one for another, that ye may be healed. The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much.



<u>2 Chronicles 7:14</u> If My people, which are called by My name, shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek My face, and turn from their wicked ways; then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land.

Biblical prayer is submission to the will of God by being obedient to His Word.

 - C. Acknowledge God's <u>SUFFICIENCY</u>—"Give us this day our daily bread" (11)
 - D. Acknowledge God as my <u>Savior</u> from sin—"Forgive us our debts" (12)
 - E. Acknowledge God as my <u>STRENGTH</u>—"Lead us not into temptation" (13)

Acknowledge God's SUPREMACY—"Hallowed be Thy name" (9)

- † My action: Be <u>REVERENT</u>
- † My Attitude: <u>WORSHIP</u>
- † My Awareness: my <u>UNWORTHINESS</u>

This places me at God's footstool as His <u>servant</u>. It reminds me of God's worthiness and my unworthiness.

<u>Hebrews 4:16</u> Let us therefore come boldly unto the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy, and find grace to help in time of need.

During this time, approach God with a sense of awe. Acknowledging Who God is by recalling His attributes but also the **implications** of those attributes—**WHO HE IS TO ME!**

- A. He is NEAR Me (Psalm 145:18)
- B. He BLESSES Me (Psalm 103)
- C. He Knows Me (Psalm 139:1-6)
- D. He SAVED Me (John 3:16)

Our Response to these Truths: STILLNESS & SUBMISSION

<u>Psalm 46:10</u> Be still [*relax in trust*], and know [*intimately and personally*] that I AM God: I will be exalted among the heathen, I will be exalted in the earth.

POINT OF ACTION: Biblical prayer begins with worship. Pray to the Father acknowledging His supremacy. Be in awe as you reverently approach His throne. Kneel at His footstool as His humble servant being reminded of God's worthiness and your unworthiness.

<u>Psalm 95:6-7</u> O come, let us worship and bow down: let us kneel before the LORD our Maker. 7 For He is our God; and we *are* the people of His pasture, and the sheep of His hand.
