**POINT OF ACTION**: Biblical prayer continues with *sorrowing* over your sin. Pray to the Father acknowledging Him as the SAVIOR from sin. Be pursuing the way of *repentance* of your sinful ways. Kneel at His footstool as His humble *sinner* being aware of your sinfulness and your great need of a daily Savior from sin.

<u>Psalm 95:6-7</u> O come, let us worship and bow down: let us kneel before the <u>LORD</u> our <u>Maker</u>. 7 For <u>He</u> *is* our <u>God</u>; and we *are* the people of <u>His</u> pasture, and the sheep of <u>His</u> hand.
