A QUIET COMMITMENT:

- QUIET your mind and soul before the LORD "Be still, and know that I am God" (Psalm 46:10)
- COMMIT to obedience: Commit to doing whatever God will say to you in this
 message "to obey is better than sacrifice" (1 Samuel 15:22)

Prayer was the lifeblood of the early church (Acts 2:42).

<u>James 5:16</u> Confess *your* faults one to another, and pray one for another, that ye may be healed. The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much.

<u>2 Chronicles 7:14</u> If My people, which are called by My name, shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek My face, and turn from their wicked ways; then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land.

Biblical prayer is submission to the will of God by being obedient to the Word of God.

1. Pray for God's Kingdom to be Advanced—"Thy kingdom come."

Surrender the advancement of my <u>foolish</u> kingdom in submission to advancing His righteous kingdom.

- C. Acknowledge God's Sufficiency—"Give us this day our daily bread" (11)
 - † My action: Be _____
 - † My Attitude: desperate DEPENDENCY
 - † My Awareness: my NEEDINESS

This places me at God's footstool as His <u>suppliant</u>. It reminds me of God's sufficiency for all things.

<u>2 Corinthians 3:5</u> Not that we are sufficient of ourselves to think any thing as of ourselves; but our sufficiency *is* of **God**;

NECESSITY IS GOD'S DIVINE MOTIVATOR TO PRAYER

- D. Acknowledge God as my Savior from sin—"Forgive us our debts" (12)
- † My action: Be
- † My Attitude: <u>SORROW</u>
- † My Awareness: my SINFULNESS

This places me at God's footstool as *sinner* in need of a daily *Savior*.

THE WAY OF REPENTANCE

SEEING ORIEVING CONFESSING FORSAKING
1. The Probleм: My (James 4:17)
2. The Provision: <u>Forgiveness</u> through the work of Savior
3. The PETITION: My <u>CONFESSION</u> of my SIN
<u>Proverbs 28:13</u> He that covereth his sins [refusal to admit guilt] <u>shall not</u> prosper: but whoso confesseth [acknowledge my sin] and forsaketh [turn from my sin] them shall have mercy.
4. The Principle and Promise: My OTHERS
The <i>principle</i> is our responsibility of obedience while the <i>promise</i> is God's response to our obedience.
E. Acknowledge God as my <u>STRENGTH</u> —"Lead us not into temptation" (13)
† My action: Be
† My Attitude: desperate <u>DEPENDENCY</u> † My Awareness: my <u>WEAKNESS</u>
This places me at God's footstool as <i>spiritually weak</i> and in need of God's strength.
This petition acknowledges a healthy distrust for our own ability to resist temptation and endure a trial in our own strength. It expresses a proper attitude, desiring to keep away from sin altogether.

<u>1 Corinthians 10:13</u> There hath no temptation taken you but such as is common to man: but God <i>is</i> faithful, Who will not suffer [<i>allow</i>] you to be tempted above that ye are able; but will with the temptation also make a way to escape, that ye may be able to bear [<i>endure</i>] <i>it</i> .

With these words we acknowledge His sovereignty in His kingdom, His supremacy of power, His sufficiency in provision, and our desire to see His name be glorified.

POINT OF ACTION: Biblical prayer closes with reverential awe as we worship the Lord for Who He is and for what He will do. We begin and end at His footstool as His servant acknowledging His worthiness and our unworthiness.

<u>Psalm 95:6-7</u> O come, let us worship and bow down: let us kneel before the <u>LORD</u> our <u>Maker</u>. 7 For <u>He</u> is our <u>God</u>; and we are the people of <u>His</u> pasture, and the sheep of <u>His</u> hand.
