A QUIET COMMITMENT:

- QUIET your mind and soul before the LORD "Be still, and know that I am God" (Psalm 46:10)
- COMMIT to obedience: *Commit* to doing whatever God will say to you in this message "to obey is better than sacrifice" (1 Samuel 15:22)
- I. The WEALTH of the Believer (1:1-3:21)
 - A. The Christian and His RICHES (1:3-23)
 - B. The Christian and His RECONCILIATION (2:1-22)

Dr. Jim Berg – The word *reconciliation* means that an exchange has taken place. The estranged parties have exchanged a previous relationship of animosity for a whole new relationship of friendship, kindness, peace, and good will. The new relationship is to be more than just an agreement "to get along from now on" or a mere adjustment or boundary-setting exercise. It is to bear all the hallmarks of the primal relationship of the believer with Christ when "*old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new*" (2 Corinthians 5:17).

1. God brings about a SAVING UNION (1-10)

God reconciles the sinner to Himself bringing about a saving union. Paul reminds the believer about his *past* to help him appreciate what he has in the *present* so that he will seek to be more effective in pursuing his *purpose* of walking in "good works."

a. The Christian's PAST PROBLEM—SIN (1-3)

i. You were DEAD (1)

<u>Isaiah 59:2</u> But your iniquities have separated between you and your **God**, and your sins have hid *His* face from you, that **He** will not hear.

A *"transgression"* is stepping over a line whether willful or unintentional. It is to disobey God's commandments.

James 2:10 For whosoever shall keep the whole law, and yet offend in one *point*, he is guilty of all.

This word translated "sins" literally speaks of missing the mark. It implies our weakness of falling short of God's righteous standard of perfection.

ii. You were DISOBEDIENT (2)

Here in Eph 2:2-3 we see our past condition before being "in Christ."

This "*course*" or age is the contemporary moral atmosphere and philosophy that is ruled by the "*god of this world*" and dominates the culture in which we live.

<u>2 Corinthians 4:4</u> In whom the god of this world hath blinded the minds of them which believe not, lest the light of the glorious Gospel of **Christ**, **Who** is the image of **God**, should shine unto them.

iii. You were DEPRAVED (3a)

This word *"lust"* speaks of a passionate *longing* which in this case has a controlling dominance.

<u>Galatians 3:22</u> But the Scripture hath concluded all under sin, that the promise by faith of Jesus Christ might be given to them that believe.

iv. You were DOOMED (3b)

John 3:18-19 He that believeth on Him is not condemned: but he that believeth not is condemned already, because he hath not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God. 19 And this is the condemnation [*judgment*], that Light is come into the world, and men loved darkness rather than Light, because their deeds were evil.

<u>**1** John 1:8</u> If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us.

b. The Christian's PRESENT—SALVATION (4-6)

Consider the apostle Paul's words juxtaposed with the apostle John's speaking of us as children before and after salvation (Ephesians 2:1-3 & John 1:12). Notice how the "children of disobedience," who are "children of wrath" become "[children] son's of God."

i. You are a recipient of God's LOVE—LOVED (4)

This "*mercy*" is the rescue from a miserable, hopeless condition. It is <u>not</u> receiving the punishment that we deserve.

<u>Titus 3:3-4</u> For we ourselves also were sometimes foolish, disobedient, deceived, serving divers lusts and pleasures, living in malice and envy, hateful, *and* hating one another. **4** But after that the kindness [*gentleness*] and love of **God** our **Saviour** toward man appeared,



Our WORTHY WALK contains an honest understanding of our reconciliation to God. We were spiritually "*DEAD in our trespasses and sins*," DISOBEDIENT, DEPRAVED, and DOOMED being

under the wrath of God. "*BUT GOD*"—He stepped in and now you have spiritual life being saved "*by grace through faith*" in the finished work of Jesus Christ on our behalf. Rejoice and live in "*His great love wherewith He loved us*."
