## MAKE A QUIET COMMITMENT:

- QUIET your mind and soul before the LORD "Be still, and know that I am God" (Psalm 46:10)
- COMMIT to obedience: Commit to doing whatever God will say to you in this
  message "to obey is better than sacrifice" (1 Samuel 15:22)

In the first half of this chapter Paul spells out what had been REVEALED to him regarding the "mystery"—the reconciliation of Jew and Gentile within the Church. In the continuation of his prayer he seeks to help these saints REALIZE the transcendent truth of God's love. This is done through the spiritual strengthening of the believer as they grow in their understanding of "the love of God" and are changed by it as they are "filled with all the fulness of God."

The Christian's reality displays the ruling of God in our submission. To "know the love of Christ" leads to being "filled with all the fulness of God."

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<ol> <li>DEVOTION through submission</li> </ol>				
<u>John 15:7</u> If ye abide in <b>Me</b> , and <b>My</b> words abide in you, ye shall ask what ye will, and it				
shall be done unto you.				
Our abiding in Christ displays our devotion through submission which is uncompromising obedience to our Master Jesus.				
<u>Colossians 3:23</u> And whatsoever ye do, do <i>it</i> heartily, as to the <b>Lord</b> , and not unto men;				
Cf Matthew 26:20: Hebrows 10:7: Philippians 2:9				
Cf. Matthew 26:39; Hebrews 10:7; Philippians 2:8				
2. DOMINATION by His righteous ruling				
"that ye might be filled." (Eph 3:19) – The Greek word, "pleróö" (play-ro'-o) translated, "filled" carries the idea of control, being dominated. It is "filled" to the degree of causing a response—bringing a change.				
Illustration: "filled with anger / joy, etc." (cf. John 16:6; Acts 5:17-18; Romans 1:29).				
<u>1 Peter 1:15-16</u> But as <b>He</b> which hath called you is holy [set apart from sin], so be ye holy in all manner of conversation; <b>16</b> Because it is written, Be ye holy; for I am holy.				
3. DISPLAYING the likeness of Christ				
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<u>Matthew 5:48</u> Be ye therefore perfect [ <i>spiritually mature</i> ], even as your <b>Father</b> which is in heaven is perfect.				
<u>Colossians 2:9</u> For in Him [Jesus] dwelleth all the fulness of the Godhead bodily.				
<u>Psalm 17:15</u> As for me [David], I will behold [gaze / meditated upon] Thy face in righteousness: I shall be satisfied, when I awake, with Thy likeness.				
<u>2 Corinthians 3:18</u> But we all, with open face [ <i>unobstructed view</i> ] beholding as in a glass the glory of the <b>Lord</b> , are changed [ <i>metamorphosis</i> ] into the same image from glory to glory, <i>even</i> as by the <b>Spirit</b> of the <b>Lord</b> .				

- (a) The Christian's RENEWING—Surrender (16b)
  - (i) He does not STIFLE the SPIRIT of GOD (1Thessalonians 5:19 / Ephesians 4:30)
  - (ii) He keeps in STEP with the SPIRIT of GOD (Galatians 5:16)
  - (iii) He diligently STUDIES the WORD of GOD (1 Timothy 4:15-16)
- (b) The Christian's RIGHTEOUSNESS— Sanctification (17a)
  - (i) MY PRAYER: "Search me, O God" (Psalm 139:23-24)
  - (ii) MY PRACTICE: Confession & Forsaking (1 John 1:9; Proverbs 28:13)
  - (iii) MY PERSPECTIVE: God delights in mercy (Micah 7:18; Psalm 86:5)
- (c) The Christian's ROOTS—Stability (17b)
- (d) The Christian's REALITY—Sacrifice (18-19a)

A Christian that is properly rooted in love will naturally lead to a new reality of living of life of loving service—a life of supreme and sacrificial love. A comprehension of this transforming truth that is evidenced in Christ likeness. **To know this kind of love is to be known by this kind of love.** (cf. John 13:34-35)

(e) The Christian's RULING—Submission (19b)

A life that is ruled by God—a virtuous life—is a life that makes the love of God attractive to others. It is a life that displays the characteristics of God in Christ-likeness (Titus 2:10—"adorning the doctrine of God").



Our worthy walk is a life that is RULED BY GOD. It is a life of DEVOTION as we "abide in Christ." It is a life DOMINATED by God's righteous ruling which DISPLAYS THE LIKENESS OF CHRIST to the world in which we live. IT IS A LIFE OF SPIRITUAL STRENGTH.
