## MAKE A QUIET COMMITMENT:

- QUIET your mind and soul before the LORD "Be still, and know that I am God" (Psalm 46:10)
- COMMIT to obedience: *Commit* to doing whatever God will say to you in this message *"to obey is better than sacrifice"* (1 Samuel 15:22)
- I. The WEALTH of the Believer (1:1-3:21)
- II. The WALK of the Believer (4:1-6:9)
  - A. Walk WORTHY (4:1)
  - B. Walk in UNITY (4:2-6)
  - C. Walk in DIVERSITY (4:7-10)
  - D. Walk in MATURITY (4:11-16)
  - E. Walk in PURITY (4:17-24)

Paul now moves from the topic of MATURITY to PURITY. He uses the illustration of the CHANGING OF CLOTHING to describe the visible change that is to be seen in the believer's life. He is to have a new kind of wardrobe. When we "*put on*" Christ, in salvation, we receive a NEW SPIRITUAL IDENTITY and with new responsibilities. We must live in light of our new identity (cf. 2 Corinthians 5:17).

#### 1. The <u>CONDITION</u> of the <u>OLD</u> Man (4:17-19)

Paul tells us that the CONDITION OF THE OLD MAN IS ROOTED IN HIS THINKING. His thinking defines his living.

#### 2. The <u>CHANGE</u> of the <u>NEW</u> Man (4:20-24)

To "*learn Christ,*" being "*taught by Him*" brings continued change in our sanctification. In these next three verses, Paul lays out for us the roadmap of growth and victory in our Christian lives. It is a **LIFE OF REPENTANCE** that leads to a **LIFE OF REFLECTING CHRIST**.

- a. DEVELOPING CHRISTLIKENESS through <u>REPENTANCE</u> from SIN (4:22a)
- b. DEVELOPING CHRISTLIKENESS through <u>RESTRAINING</u> our FLESH (4:22b)

In order to effectively RESTRAIN our flesh and help our REPENTANCE from sin be long-lasting we must learn to diligently RENEW our minds with the TRANSFORMING and STABILIZING truths of God's Word.

> c. DEVELOPING CHRISTLIKENESS through <u>RENEWING</u> our MIND (4:23)

Introduction: Biblical repentance is not only a TURNING <u>FROM</u> SIN but also a TURNING <u>TO</u> TRUTH. It is a turning from a walk which dishonors God to a walk which bring honor to God.

"And be renewed in the spirit of your mind;" (<u>Eph\_4:23</u>) – The Greek word translated "renewed" carries the idea of the process of <u>RENOVATION</u>.

<u>Isaiah 59:1-2</u> Behold, the LORD'S hand is not shortened, that it cannot save; neither His ear heavy, that it cannot hear: 2 But your iniquities have separated between you and your God, and your sins have hid *His* face from you, that **He** will not hear.

<u>Galatians 5:16</u> *This* I say then, "Walk in the **Spirit**, and ye shall not fulfill the lust of the flesh."

#### i. The TEACHER of RENEWAL—Holy Spirit (2 Cor. 3:18)

<u>2 Corinthians 3:18</u> But we all, with open face beholding as in a glass the glory of the Lord, are changed into the same image from glory to glory, *even* as by the **Spirit** of the Lord.

**<u>1</u>** Corinthians 2:14 But the natural [*unregenerate*] man receive th not the things of the Spirit of God: for they are foolishness [*meaningless*] unto him: neither can he know *them,* because they are spiritually discerned [*understood*].

### ii. The TRANSFORMATION of RENEWAL (Romans 12:2)

<u>Romans 12:2</u> And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed [*changed into something useful*] by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what *is* that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of **God**.

This RENEWAL PROCESS is a REPLACEMENT PROCESS. The old mind needs to

be replaced with a new mind—the old thought must be replaced with new thoughts.

# iii. The TRUTH of RENEWAL—the Knowledge of God (Col. 3:10)

<u>Colossians 3:10</u> And have put on the new *man*, which is renewed in knowledge [of God] after [according to / based upon] the image of Him that created him [so as to reflect that same image (cf. <u>2Co 3:18</u>)]:

<u>Colossians 3:16</u> Let the Word of Christ dwell in you richly [*abundantly*] in all wisdom; teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord.

# iv. The TIME of RENEWAL (1 Timothy 4:15-16)

**<u>1</u> Timothy 4:15-16** Meditate upon these things; give thyself wholly to them; that thy profiting [*developing Christlikeness*] may appear to all. **16** Take heed unto thyself, and unto the doctrine; continue in them: for in doing this thou shalt both save thyself, and them that hear thee.

Joshua 1:8 This book of the law shall not depart out of thy mouth; but thou shalt meditate therein day and night, ...

### v. The TENACITY of RENEWAL (James 1:21-25)



Our WORTHY WALK is explained by WALKING IN PURITY. Our new life in Christ is to be marked by change. It is a PURPOSEFUL PROCESS which includes the DEVELOPMENT OF CHRISTLIKENESS which is also characterized by RENEWING the

mind with the Word of truth. This TRANSFORMATION comes with TENACITY as diligent effort is made to spend TIME meditating upon the TRUTH aided by the TEACHING of the Holy Spirit.
