MAKE A QUIET COMMITMENT:

- QUIET your mind and soul before the LORD "Be still, and know that I am God" (Psalm 46:10)
- COMMIT to obedience: Commit to doing whatever God will say to you in this
 message "to obey is better than sacrifice" (1 Samuel 15:22)

Today, we will consider our communing with God in our observance of the Lord's supper. We make it a practice to celebrate the Lord's Supper once a month on the second Sunday of the month. It is important to understand the gravity / seriousness of communion. Our walk of faith is a lifestyle which should be a declaration of our communion with God on a daily basis.

I. The INTRODUCTION: The Corinthian's <u>CARELESSNESS</u> (17-22)

Paul speaks to the hypocrisy of the Corinthian saints. He was saying that their celebration in this "unworthy" manner shows that they clearly were not interested in honoring the Lord by celebrating His saving work.

Jude speaks of the meals as being "feasts of charity" ($\underline{\text{Jude 1:12}}$) or "love feasts." They were originally intended to show love for the saints in need by sharing with one other.

II. The INSTITUTION: We are <u>COMMANDED</u>—Be WORSHIPFUL (23-26) PAUL COMMANDS US: "ATTRIBUTE THE PROPER <u>WORTH</u>"

A. The <u>SYMBOLISM</u> of the SUPPER (23)

B. The SACREDNESS of the SUPPER (24-25)

This reminder, that Christ commands, speaks of a **TRANSFORMING MEMORY**. It is an intentional focused meditation upon Christ's dying for me, living for me, all that He had done for me. It is having a mind fixed upon the Lord with a grateful heart of worship.

- C. The SIGNIFICANCE of the SUPPER (24-25)
 - 1. The PASSOVER SIGNIFICANCE

Passover reminded the Jew of God's great rescue (Exodus 12-14).

- 2. The PERSONAL SIGNIFICANCE (24-25)
 - a. The CRUCIFIXION of our LORD'S BODY (24)

<u>Isaiah 53:6</u> All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way; and the **LORD** hath laid on **Him** the iniquity of us all.

b. The COVENANT of our LORD'S BLOOD (25)

"New Testament in My blood" (1Co 11:25) – this is a covenant which stipulates the terms for entering into a new relationship.

- D. The STATEMENT of the SUPPER (26)
- "...ye do shew the Lord's death till He come." (1Co 11:26) Through our participation in observing communion we are publicly declaring what Christ has done for me.
- III. The <u>IRREVERENCE</u>: We are CAUTIONED—Be WARNED (27, 29-30) PAUL CAUTIONS US: "ADHERE TO THIS WARNING"
 - A. The CAUTION against IRREVERENCE (27)

"Wherefore whosoever shall eat this bread, and drink this cup of the Lord, unworthily, ..." (1Co 11:27) – The word "unworthily" carries the idea of irreverence. It is simply not properly preparing to partake in the Lord's Table. We are not to take the Lord's Table lightly—it is a SACRED ACT OF WORSHIP.

B. The **CONSEQUENCES** of IRREVERENCE (29-30)

"eateth and drinketh damnation" (1Co 11:29) — The Greek word translated "damnation" speaks of judgment.

- 1. The <u>LESSER</u> PENALTY—"many are <u>weak</u> and <u>sickly</u>" (30a)
- 2. The <u>GREATER</u> PENALTY—"many <u>sleep</u>" (30b)
- IV. The <u>INSPECTION</u>: We are COMPELLED—Be WISE (28, 31-32)

PAUL COMPELS US: "APPLY THIS WISDOM"

- A. There is an <u>INVITATION</u> (v. 28)
 - 1. The invitation to **EXAMINATION** (28a)

<u>Psalm 139:23</u> Search [*examine intimately*] me, O **God**, and know my heart: try me, and know my thoughts: ²⁴ And see if *there be any* wicked [*idolitrous*] way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting.

<u>1 John 1:8 & 10</u> If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. ¹⁰ If we say that we have not sinned, we make him a liar, and his word is not in us.

- 2. The invitation to **PARTICIPATION** (28b)
- B. There will be an INSPECTION (31-32)

<u>Hebrews 12:6</u> For whom the **Lord** loveth **He** chasteneth [*instructs through disciplines*], and scourgeth [*whip*] every son whom **He** receiveth.

C. There is a Word of INSIGHT (33-34)

The goal is to WORSHIP THE LORD IN COMMUNION. It is to CONSIDER CHRIST'S great work of love on our behalf. It is to HONOR HIM with a heart of gratitude for what He accomplished for

us. It is to OBEY HIM with reverence as we remember His great sacrifice because of our sin. It is to RESPOND TO HIM in repentance as we examine our own lives for sin in order to make confession. It is to WORSHIP HIM for He is worthy of praise.
