MAKE A QUIET COMMITMENT:

- QUIET your mind and soul before the LORD "Be still, and know that I am God" (Psalm 46:10)
- COMMIT to obedience: Commit to doing whatever God will say to you in this message
 — "to obey is better than sacrifice" (1 Samuel 15:22)

I. Jesus' Message of Comfort (John 14:1-14)

In this message of comfort, Jesus ministers to the troubled heart by making a plea for His followers to believe the evidence—to have simple child-like faith.

- A. Jesus' Ministers to the <u>Troubled</u> Heart (John 14:1-6)
- B. Jesus Motivates a <u>Triumphant</u> Heart (John 14:7-14)

Believing is seeing. Throughout the book of John, the Apostle emphasizes seeing the sign and believing more than just the physical. The signs emphasize a spiritual truth. The evidence proved to John that Christ has risen.

II. Jesus' Message about the **Comforter** (John 14:15-31)

Sustained comfort comes with continued dynamic faith—active faith. It is when we intentionally place our faith in action that we can enjoy a triumphant faith in troubled times.

Now, here in the second half of the chapter we will see Christ's message about the Comforter. He continues His message of comfort with a message filled with promises.

A. The <u>Precept</u> to be <u>Obeyed</u> (14:15)

<u>James 2:17-18</u> Even so faith, if it hath not works, is dead, being alone. **18** Yea, a man may say, "Thou hast faith, and I have works: shew me thy faith without thy works, and I will shew thee my faith by my works."

1. Supremely Love God—"If ye love Me"

a. A Growing Love for God (Matthew 22:37)

<u>Matthew 22:37-38</u> Jesus said unto him, "Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind. 38 This is the first and great commandment.

b. A Gazing Love toward God (2 Corinthians 3:18)

<u>2 Corinthians 3:18</u> But we all, with open face beholding as in a glass the glory of the **Lord**, are changed into the same image from glory to glory, *even* as by the **Spirit** of the **Lord**.

Your view of choice becomes your character of life. In other words, what you choose to focus on in life changes you. We take on the characteristics of what we dwell upon. We are changed into the image of what we spend time focusing on.

Romans 12:2 And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what *is* that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of **God**.

<u>Psalm 1:2</u> But his delight *is* in the law of the **LORD**; and in **His** law doth he meditate day and night.

c. A Glowing Love of God (Matthew 5:16)

<u>Matthew 5:16</u> Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your **Father** which is in heaven.

<u>John 15:12-14</u> This is **My** commandment, That ye love one another, as I have loved you. **13** Greater love hath no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends. **14** Ye are **My** friends, if ye do whatsoever I command you.

2. Sacrificially Love Others—"keep My commandments"

"... keep My Commandments." (<u>Joh_14:15</u>) – This word, "keep" carries the idea of carefully watching over something. It is to take special care to obey.

<u>Matthew 22:39</u> And the second *is* like unto it, 'Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself.'

<u>John 13:34</u> A new commandment I give unto you, That ye love one another; as I have loved you, that ye also love one another.

<u>Matthew 5:43-44</u> Ye have heard that it hath been said, "Thou shalt love thy neighbour, and hate thine enemy." **44** But I say unto you, "Love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which despitefully use you, and persecute you;"

The love that Christ was teaching was God's kind of love (1 Corinthians 13:4-8).

<u>John 13:35</u> By this shall all *men* know that ye are **My** disciples, if ye have love one to another."

<u>1 John 3:16</u> Hereby perceive we the love *of God,* because **He** laid down **His** life for us: and we ought to lay down *our* lives for the brethren.



JESUS' MESSAGE ABOUT THE COMFORTER begins with a precept to be obeyed. This message of comfort focuses on a loving Christ with a love that obeys. Genuine love for Christ is displayed

in obedience to His commands. We see that we are to supremely love God which leads to sacrificially loving others.
