MAKE A QUIET COMMITMENT:

- QUIET your mind and soul before the LORD "Be still, and know that I am God" (Psalm 46:10)
- COMMIT to obedience: Commit to doing whatever God will say to you in this message
 — "to obey is better than sacrifice" (1 Samuel 15:22)

I. Jesus' Message of Comfort (John 14:1-14)

Jesus' message to His disciples, here in John 14, is just as fitting to us as it was to them. It is a message of hope and comfort—a message a peace and joy. It is a message that ministers to a TROUBLED heart and then motivates a TRIUMPHANT heart. It is a message that brings peace when we respond to the plea that He makes while resting in the truths that He states.

II. Jesus' Message about the **Comforter** (John 14:15-31)

Here in the second half of the chapter we will see Christ's message about the Comforter. He continues His message of comfort with a message filled with promises. These promises are part of a Biblical principle of genuine discipleship. They can be enjoyed when this precept is obeyed.

A. The <u>Precept</u> to be <u>Obeyed</u> (John 14:15)

The precept within this Biblical principle of supreme love for God is a command to obey. Our SUPREME LOVE FOR CHRIST is displayed in OBEDIENT SACRIFICIAL LOVE FOR OTHERS. We must understand that a GROWING LOVE for God is *dependent* upon our GAZING LOVE toward God which will be *displayed* in our GLOWING LOVE for God which is a sacrificial love for others.

B. The Promises to be Enjoyed (John 14:16-26)

The promise within this Biblical principle of supreme love for God is to be enjoyed by those who fulfil the precept of loving obedience which displays a genuine Christianity.

1. The promise of a **Spiritual Relationship** (John 14:16-17)

It is important to note that Christ did not lay out for His followers a life of rigid instructions for them to obey. It isn't primarily about religious behavior. He is explaining that the life of one who follows Him is characterized by a loving relationship that results in loving obedience.

Here Christ emphasizes spiritual presence vs. His physical presence.

a. Marked by His **Encouraging** Presence (John 14:16a)

John 14:16 And **I** will pray the **Father**, and **He** shall give you another **Comforter**, ... This "*Comforter*" or helper—lit. "one called alongside to help".

Notice that the Holy Spirit's ministry would include "testifying of Christ" (John 15:26) and "bringing all things to their remembrance, whatsoever I have said unto you" (John 14:26).

Galatians 1:6 I marvel that ye are so soon removed from **Him** that called you into the grace of **Christ** unto another gospel:

b. Marked by His Continual Presence (John 14:16b)

John 14:16 ... that He may abide with you forever;

c. Marked by His **Guiding** Presence (John 14:17)

Jesus, Who is the "Word" (John 1:1), had just stated that He was "the Way, the Truth, and the Life" (John 14:6), here we see that the Holy Spirit is marked by the same characteristic of truth.

John 15:26 But when the Comforter is come, Whom I will send unto you from the Father, even the Spirit of Truth, which proceedeth from the Father, He [the Spirit] shall testify of Me:

John 16:13 Howbeit when He, the Spirit of truth, is come, He will guide you into all truth: for He shall not speak of Himself [his own authority]; but whatsoever He shall hear, that shall He speak: and He will shew you things to come.

1 Corinthians 2:14 But the natural man receiveth not the things of the **Spirit** of **God**: for they are foolishness unto him: neither can he know *them,* because they are spiritually discerned.

John 1:10-12 He was in the world, and the world was made by Him, and the world knew Him not. 11 He [Jesus] came unto His own, and His own received Him not. 12 But as many as received Him, to them gave He power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on His name:

1 Corinthians 6:19 What? know ye not that your body is the temple of the **Holy Ghost** *which is* in you, which ye have of **God**, and ye are not your own?

d. Marked by His Comforting presence (John 14:18)

Matthew 28:20 ...and, lo, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world. Amen.



JESUS' MESSAGE ABOUT THE COMFORTER continues with promises to be enjoyed within a loving and obedient Spiritual relationship. The presence of the Holy Spirit enables the believer

to live a life of loving obedience. This promise is marked by the Spirit's ENCOURAGING and CONTINUAL presence, along with His GUIDING and COMFORTING presence.
