MAKE A QUIET COMMITMENT:

- QUIET your mind and soul before the LORD "Be still, and know that I am God" (Psalm 46:10)
- COMMIT to obedience: Commit to doing whatever God will say to you in this message "to obey is better than sacrifice" (1 Samuel 15:22)

Here in John 14, Jesus is in the process of preparing His disciples for His death and departure. He has told them that He would be taken and crucified; that one of them would betray Him; another would deny Him; and all of them would forsake Him.

Here in the first half of John 14 we see Christ's message of COMFORT as He seeks to prepare His followers for the trials of life.

- I. Jesus' Message of Comfort (John 14:1-14)
- II. Jesus' Message about the Comforter (John 14:15-31)

Jesus is seeking to comfort His disciples who are troubled by the news of His departure and death. He is teaching His disciples the PRINCIPLE OF TRIUMPHANT CHRISTIANITY which contains the PRECEPT of love displayed in sacrificial obedience.

A. The Precept to be Obeyed (14:15)

B. The Promises to be Enjoyed (14:16-26)

The promises within this Biblical PRINCIPLE OF TRIUMPHANT CHRISTIANITY is to be enjoyed by those who fulfil the precept of loving obedience which displays a genuine Christianity.

1. The PROMISE of a **Spiritual** Relationship (John 14:16-18)

2. The PROMISE of a <u>Life-Giving Relationship</u> (John 14:19-20)

He continues His words of comfort by emphasizing the PROMISE OF A LIFE-GIVING RELATIONSHIP which is characteristic of His own life—abundant and eternal life that was His to give.

a. Marked by His Characteristic (19)

<u>Joh 14:19</u> Yet a little while, and the world seeth **Me** no more; but ye see **Me**: <u>because I live, ye shall live also</u>.

<u>John 10:10-11</u> "The thief cometh not, but for to steal, and to kill, and to destroy: "I AM come that they might have life, and that they might have *it* more abundantly [*overflowing*]. 11 "I AM the Good Shepherd: the Good Shepherd giveth His life for the sheep.

<u>1 John 5:11-13</u> And this is the record, that **God** hath given to us eternal life, and this life is in **His Son**. **12** He that hath the **Son** hath life; *and* he that hath not the **Son** of **God** hath not life. **13** These things have I written unto you that believe on the name of the **Son** of **God**; that ye may know that ye have eternal life, and that ye may [continue to] believe on the name of the **Son** of **God**.

<u>Galatians 2:20</u> I am crucified with <u>Christ</u>: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but <u>Christ</u> liveth in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh [*physically*] I live by the faith of the <u>Son of God</u>, <u>Who</u> loved me, and gave <u>Himself</u> for me.

b. Marked by their **Confidence** (20)

- 3. The PROMISE of a Loving Relationship (21-24)
 - a. Marked by His Loving Presence (21)
 - b. Marked by Loving Obedience (22-24)
 - i. An important CONCEPT (23a)

<u>John 13:34-35</u> A new commandment I give unto you, That ye love one another; as I have loved you, that ye also love one another. **35** By this shall all *men* know that ye are **My** disciples, if ye have love one to another."

<u>1 John 4:20-21</u> If a man say, "I love God," and hateth his brother, he is a liar: for he that loveth not his brother whom he hath seen, how can he love God whom he hath not seen? 21 And this commandment have we from Him, That he who loveth God love his brother also.

ii. An important Certainty (23b)

<u>Psalm 34:18</u> The LORD *is* nigh unto them that are of a broken heart [*speaks of great humility*]; and saveth such as be of a contrite [*meek*] spirit.

iii. An important COntrast (24)

Christ calls for His disciples to move beyond a profession of love for Him and in turn evidence that love. In light of Peter's strong profession of loyalty in <u>Joh 13:37</u> Jesus encourages a move from promised loyalty to practiced loyalty in the way that one obeys His words.



JESUS' MESSAGE ABOUT THE COMFORTER continues with the promises to be enjoyed. He promises a life-giving relationship in which He declares His commitment to give His followers the same quality of

life that He enjoys. This is followed by His promise of a loving relationship filled with the loving presence of the indwelling Trinity.
