



MAKE A QUIET COMMITMENT:

- QUIET your mind and soul before the LORD "Be still, and know that I am God" (Psalm 46:10)
- COMMIT to obedience: Commit to doing whatever God will say to you in this
 message "to obey is better than sacrifice" (1 Samuel 15:22)

We are considering the new year seeking to enjoy God's success in the unknown ahead by applying the principles found in the book of Joshua.

2 Timothy 2:21 If a man therefore purge [cleanse] himself from these [iniquity (v. 19)], he shall be a vessel unto honour, sanctified [set apart], and meet [useful] for the **Master's** use, and prepared unto every good work.



In Joshua chapter 1 we saw a command to be FAITHFUL TO THE WORD. The end result of being obedient to this principle was GODly success.

In Joshua 2, we considered RAHAB'S DYNAMIC (ACTIVE) FAITH. Rahab, by *faith*, acted upon the limited truth she heard about God and was *obedient*.

In Joshua 3 the focus shifts from the DYNAMIC FAITH of an INDIVIDUAL to the DYNAMIC FAITH of a NATION as the Israelites are called upon to take a STEP FORWARD IN FAITH.

Memorial Stones of God's Faithfulness (Joshua 4)

Now here in Joshua 4 there is a call to remember the FAITHFULNESS OF GOD. The command is to remember the mighty hand of God displayed in the steps of faith of His people to help us walk in the fear of God.



The key to victory is in the MEMORIAL STONES OF GOD'S FAITHFULNESS. The memorial stones remind us of the mighty working of God in our lives. These memorial stones encourage us

to meditate on God and His wonderful works.

Lamentations 3:21 This I recall to my mind, therefore have I hop	e.
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1 Thessalonians 5:24 Faithful is He that calleth	you, Who also will do it.
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- I. The **Setting** (Joshua 4:1-5)
- II. The Significance (Joshua 4:6-21)
 - A. The Significant Question—"What mean ye by these stones?" (Joshua 4:6)

Keep in mind that God had commanded Moses to teach the people to be diligent in their theological training of the next generation (Deuteronomy 6:6-7).

- B. The Significant Answer—"look what God did" (Joshua 4:7)
- III. The Success (Joshua 4:21-24)

Let's make a **commitment** to communicate what God has done.

A. Their **Redemptive Influence** upon the next **Generation**—
"then ye shall let your children know" (Joshua 4:22-23)

Notice the phrase "your God" in vs. 23-24. Giving witness of God working in our lives will encourage others to come to KNOW Jesus as their Savior or it will help them to GROW to be more like Jesus.

B. Their **Redemptive Influence** upon their "Jerusalem"—"that all the people of the world may know" (Joshua 4:24a)

Acts 1:8 But ye shall receive power, after that the **Holy Ghost** is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses [*Grk. "martus"*] unto **Me** both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth.

C. Their **Redemptive** Living in their "Jerusalem"—"that ye might fear the LORD" (Joshua 4:24b)

Ecclesiastes 12:13-14 Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter: Fear **God**, and keep **His** commandments: for this *is* the whole *duty* of man. **14** For **God** shall bring every work into judgment, with every secret thing, whether *it be* good, or whether *it be* evil.

Let's make a concerted effort to mark these times.

- What do you remember about the Lord and His working in you through that time? How do you intentionally remember these times?
- ? What do others remember about those times in your life?

Take some time and write down the memorial stones of God's faithfulness in your life. Be encouraged to take a step forward in faith seeing the faithfulness of our great God.
